Education Activities:

Fly Tying: Our basic fly tying classes started on Feb. 2 and will continue through the 29. We are tying all types of streamers/bucktails this month. You can attend any of these classes you like. The club supplies all materials and equipment. No signup is necessary. The classes are held at the Sunnyslope Community Center from 7 - 9 PM. Basic Fly Casting: We will have a class in the basics of fly casting on Feb. 25 at Steele Indian School Park from 9 - 11 AM. We will gather on the far west side of the park. You enter off Central about 1/2 mile north of Indian School Rd. In addition to the basic instruction we will cover some of the more advanced techniques used when casting sinking, sink tip and integrated shooting heads. The club has the basic equipment for those that are just starting. Ron Robinson will bring some of the different type of sinking lines. If you have sinking lines please bring those as this will give you more time to practice with equipment you use in fishing.

Basic Class in Spey Casting: Bruce Williams and Molly Semenik will be giving a class in the basics of spey casting at Granada Park on Feb. 18 from 9 - 11 AM. Granada Park is located on 20th. Street just south of Lincoln Blvd. The turn off is just east of the 51 Freeway. You will need to bring your own equipment if you want to do two handed spey casting. You can also do single handed spey casting with any rod you are currently using so bring that and enjoy the instruction. Bruce and Molly are FFF certified casting instructors and will give high quality instruction. This is something you don't want to miss. 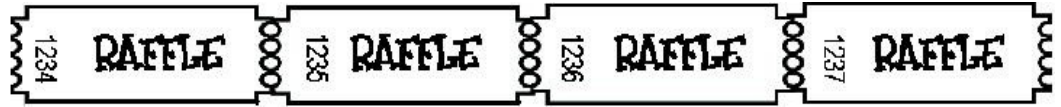
Here is an opportunity you may well have been waiting for; a chance to give back to the membership at large!

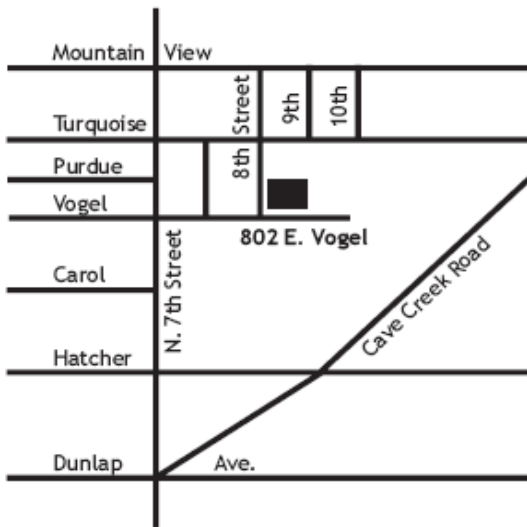
